Our Origin Story

Established during Canada's mega-musical revolution in the 1990s, Randolph College for the Performing Arts was the country's first post-secondary educational institution to offer multi-disciplinary "Triple Threat" training to aspiring professional performers.

Under advisement from a committee of leaders in the musical theatre industry, RCPA founder George Randolph formulated a strategic plan for a professional training institution with a curriculum that could respond quickly to the industry's needs and prepare multi-disciplinary performers – "Triple Threats" – who could meet the demands of careers on stage and screen, thrive in the dynamic life in the arts, and be situated in the industry's Canadian hub, Toronto.

The Randolph School of the Arts opened its doors in 1992, offering equal training in acting for stage, dance, and vocal.

RCPA continues to be on the cutting edge of performing arts education, investing in new musical theatre creation as part of curriculum in 2018; being the first theatre program in Canada to offer intimacy training as a standard part of its curriculum; and building Academic Pathway Agreements for students to augment their training with bachelor's degrees from Wilfrid Laurier University, Yorkville University, as well as master's degree opportunities with the Guildford School of Acting in Surrey, England, and the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow, Scotland.*

More than just a musical theatre school, we transform performers into multi-faceted professional artists through a rigorous Triple Threat training program that integrates acting for the stage and screen, vocal and dance (jazz, ballet, tap), as well as theory and history. Throughout all of this all of this, we never lose sight of what really matters: making sure what makes you unique as a performer is nurtured and allowed to flourish.

Over the course of your two years at Randolph College for the Performing Arts, you will:

- Hone audition and performance skills in the core disciplines of the performing arts
- Receive individual attention from professional faculty teaching an industry-driven curriculum in a focused conservatory setting
- Build a network with faculty, visiting artists, staff, alumni and key influencers in the arts and entertainment industry
- Live and learn in the heart of Canada's cultural capital
- Showcase your skills for industry decision makers in a professionally staged play production and musical production
- Join alumni working on and behind stages and screens on Broadway, Toronto, the West End, Los Angeles, and elsewhere
- Become eligible to pursue a BMus (Hons.) through a credit transfer agreement with Wilfrid Laurier University, an online bachelor's degree with Yorkville University, and master's degree opportunities with Royal Conservatoire of Scotland or Guildford School of Acting. Post graduation, RCPA grads go on to enjoy employment across various fields. 87.8% of our students graduate the program, which is 15% higher than the average approved vocational program in Ontario. Our graduates enjoy a 94.7% employment rate, also 15% higher than the average approved vocational program in Ontario. Additionally, surveyed employers of RCPA grads report a 100% satisfaction rate with alumni work.

Jeannie has been a member of the music faculty at Randolph College for the past 23 years and was the Associate Music Director at Metropolitan Community Church Toronto for 8 years. She's served as keyboardist for Seussical, Billy Elliot, Mamma Mia! and Lord of the Rings. She is also active as a Clinician and Adjudicator. Jeannie received her Associateship Diplomas in Voice and Piano from the Western Conservatory of Music and studied Opera at the American Institute for Musical Studies in Graz, Austria. Jeannie has toured North America with Riverdance - The Show and toured and recorded extensively with the Elmer Iseler Singers, including an appearance with the Canadian Brass at Carnegie Hall and on the soundtrack to Schindler's List with John Williams. She has appeared as a soloist with the AIMS Festival Orchestra, Summer Opera Lab, Vocalpoint Chamber Choir and the Toronto Mendelssohn Youth Choir with whom she was a Vocal Coach for seven years.

Our Facilities

Randolph College is fully equipped with what you need as a student to succeed, from tutorial rooms equipped with their own keyboards, to studios furnished with ballet bars, sound systems, and wifi. Additionally, RCPA has two theatres on site; a 514 seat proscenium stage, and a 100 seat thrust stage, allowing you to get even more experience for the professional industry. We remain open after hours and on weekends to allow you to book space in one of our various studios or tutorial rooms, so you can put in the time to really nail that monologue, song, or combo.

Royal Conservatoire of Scotland

RCPA graduates may audition for entry into the RCS's one-year Masters in Music
Theatre Performance program. RCS is a world-leading conservatoire of music, drama,
dance, production and film that has been ranked fifth in the world for performing arts
education by the prestigious QS World Rankings 2018.

Guildford School of Acting

• Guildford School of Acting: RCPA graduates may audition for entry into the any of the Guildford School of Acting's one-year Masters programs in Acting, Creative Practices and Direction, and Musical Theatre Performance. GSA is one of the most highly regarded theatre schools in the UK, offering world-class conservatoire training and research within a top university environment.

PATHWAY PROGRAMS

Honour's Bachelors Degree Opportunities*

Wilfrid Laurier University, Honours BMus in Community Music

• Students will gain experience and skills performing in many music genres and in different settings, from formal concerts to participatory community events. A key feature of the program is an emphasis on music creation and working collaboratively. Students will graduate with extensive experience in creative songwriting, improvisation and student-driven performance. Instructors also teach leadership and musicianship skills that will enable students to facilitate participatory music-making.

Wilfrid Laurier University, Honours BMus in Self Directed Studies

RCPA graduates can enrol in Wilfrid Laurier's Honours BMus in Self-Directed Studies to complete their bachelor's degree
with an additional two years (10.0 credits) of full-time study. Applicants must earn admission to the programs through the
normal audition procedures and be subject to the same terms and conditions as any other student. The Self-Directed
Studies program is designed to give students a well-rounded musical education with the freedom to choose electives in a
variety of subjects, both in and outside of music. Self-Directed Studies balances weekly studio lessons, masterclasses and
ensemble rehearsals. Courses are divided in thematic areas of Culture & Society, Performance and Production and Style &
Structure.

Yorkville University, Bachelor of Creative Arts (Online or On-Campus)*

• The Bachelor of Creative Arts program is designed to give students who already hold a diploma in an artistic discipline the practical business and leadership skills needed to succeed in the creative arts industries. Developed for full-time students and those in the workforce, this flexible degree completion program can be completed in as few as 15 months. Students will gain a complete understanding of the methodologies, tools and perspectives of their chosen industries, including talent management, project budgeting, financial planning, and legal and ethical considerations in the creative arts.



Apply and Audition

Admission to Randolph College For The Performing Arts is granted based on a combination of an inperson or video audition, application package, interview and personal statement.

Application Package

To be considered for admission to Randolph College For The Performing Arts, prospective students must complete an application package consisting of:

- An online application form;
- A non-refundable application fee of CAD\$75;
- A headshot or recent photo showing head and shoulders (no costumes or stage makeup);
- A resume (performing arts and/or employment);
- An official high school transcript stating that the applicant is a Grade 12 graduate and has (or will have by the first day of class) achieved a minimum 65% in Grade 12 English (or equivalent);
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach or mentor telling us why they believe you would succeed at RCPA. If you are a prospective International Student, please note that there are additional elements to your application

Audition Requirements

When your application package has been received, the College will provide detailed instructions for completing and submitting your video audition, including tips and tricks to help you shine. You'll also be asked to write a 200-word personal statement.

Additional Requirements

Upon receipt of your video audition and personal statement, you'll be contacted by the Registrar to complete an interview with a member of our audition panel via Zoom.

Getting In

Our audition panel will evaluate your video audition and all of your supporting documents, and will make a decision in late October 2023 for January 2024 applicants, or late February 2024 for September 2024 applicants.

Tuition and Fees

RCPA's program is three academic years in total, with payments made at the beginning of each academic year (3 installments total). Tuition is tax deductible. Tuition costs do not include books, materials, equipment or accommodation.*

Application Fee is CAD\$75 for video auditions; this fee is non-refundable Domestic Tuition is CAD\$12,500 per academic year (3 academic years in total) International Tuition is CAD\$22,500 per academic year (3 academic years in total) Materials fee is \$300 per academic year (3 academic years in total) Compulsory Ancilliary fee is \$335 per academic year (3 academic years in total)
